**Greater Cambridge Planning Obligations Supplementary Planning Document
Statement of Adoption and Revocation**

Notice is hereby given that, in accordance with Regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2012, the Greater Cambridge Planning Obligations Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was adopted by Cambridge City Council on 24 March 2026 and South Cambridgeshire District Council on 3 February 2026.

Upon adoption, it is intended to revoke the Cambridge City Council Planning Obligations Strategy SPD 2010, as it will be superseded by this SPD. Specific elements of the South Cambridgeshire Open Space in New Development SPD will be superseded, in particular in relation to costings, but the document overall will remain a material consideration.

Any person aggrieved by the adoption of the SPD may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of the decision to adopt the SPD by the Councils. Any such application must be made promptly and, in any event, not later than 3 months after the date on which the SPD was adopted (24 March 2026 for Cambridge City Council and 3 February 2026 for South Cambridgeshire District Council).
